Colin Evans (Chairman)

Colin Evans is the owner of Cantref Adventure Farm, which won UK National Farm Attraction of the Year 2016.



Mick Collins

Mick is director of Outdoors@hay, an adventure activity & accommodation provider in Hay on Wye. After leaving the Army with exemplary service in the Commando Forces, he continued an outdoor-related career working in an independent school teaching outdoor education, managing outdoor centres, freelance instructing and leading winning teams in endurance events. Mick works in partnership with his wife, already running B&B and self-catering properties in Hay before starting Outdoors@hay. He was one of the first outdoor operators in the UK to be awarded the Accredited Practitioner of the Institute of Outdoor Learning (APIOL) and is also a Member of SWOAPG.





Elizabeth Daniel

Elizabeth has run Brecon Beacons Holiday Cottage and Farmhouses Ltd for the past 35 years and has in the region of 375 properties. The business now has an office with shop-frontage in Brecon and she employs 11 staff. The business has built up slowly always through word of mouth over the years. Elizabeth has a very thorough knowledge of the Brecon Beacons area, and has always been passionate about the National Park.

Andrew Fryer

After a successful career in Royal Mail in Organisational Development, Andrew moved to Wales and developed a portfolio of activities. Andrew's main business is a 5 star bunkhouse on Llangattock Hillside opened in 2006 which is run on environmentally friendly lines (it's a Green Tourism Business Scheme Gold site & won the Visit Wales Tourism award for sustainability in 2010). The bunkhouse is also a Youth Hostel Association (YHA) enterprise site which is marketed in partnership with the YHA. Andrew is passionate about co-operative marketing and has become very involved in tourism activity



locally. In addition, he is fully involved in a range of other activities including lecturing with The Open University Business School, Chair of a range of environmental not for profit organisations, and a panellist on Employment Tribunals.

He joined the Forestry Commission in 1993 as a Ranger in East Anglia, spent three years in the Forest of Dean as Chief Ranger from 1999 before moving to Wales in 2003 as Recreation Advisor for Wales. Helen Howarth


